

SERVICE OF LESSONS AND CAROLS

The Service of Lessons & Carols has enjoyed great popularity since it was first introduced roughly a century ago. In many places it has come to be regarded as THE service of Christmas Eve. While it is called "Lessons & Carols", not every hymn is, strictly speaking, a carol. This is due to the fact that the purpose of the service is to trace redemption's history from the Fall of our ancestors through the promises of the prophets, and finally to the birth of Christ. While the choice of hymns varies from place to place, the lessons have largely remained the same. Thus, the service is one of hearing the lesson, then hearing an accompanying hymn that reflects the truth of the lesson. Here tonight, at Holy Spirit Lutheran Church, we will, with so many others, also trace salvation's history in lesson and song. May your heart be warmed as you contemplate tonight the mystery of the coming of God to us in the flesh.

P: BIDDING PRAYER

I welcome you, on behalf of The Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit. We have come together as the family of God, in our Father's presence, to celebrate the great festival of Christmas. In this service we hear and receive the good news of the birth of Christ and we offer to God our thanksgiving in the joyful singing of carols.

- **G**: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed by thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.










LESSON 4 – Micah 5:2, 4-5a The Prophet Micah foretells that the Messiah will come from Bethlehem.



LESSON 5 – Luke 1:26-35, 38 The angel Gabriel salutes the Blessed Virgin Mary.



P: WORDS OF INSTITUTION

In the night in which He was betrayed our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take, eat; this is My † body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me." Again, after supper, He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in MY † blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of Me."

C: Thanks be to God.

In the blessed sacrament of the altar, we celebrate our Lord's communion with us. He said, "I will never leave you or forsake you." This is how He keeps that promise. Because His promise is to the entire Church, we proclaim that this altar is not our private property. It's His. We invite all baptized persons who believe in His real presence in the bread and wine, to come, receive and believe!
