He puts the five nails into the candle, saying:

P By His wounds we have healing both now and forever. Amen.

Then, lighting the candle, Pastor says:

P May the light of Christ, who is risen in glory from the dead, scatter all the darkness of our hearts and minds.

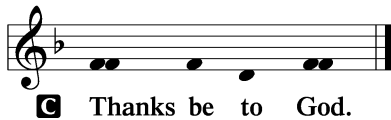
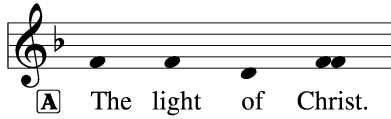

At the entrance of the nave, the bearer of the paschal candle stops and chants:

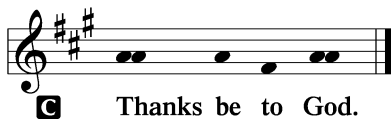


When the candle bearer reaches the middle of the nave, he chants for the second time:

After the candle bearer places the paschal candle in its place, Pastor chants the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet).
