The Third Petition of the Lord's Prayer

What is the third petition?

C Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

What does this mean?

The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

How is God's will done?

G God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come; and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die. This is His good and gracious will.

Hymn of the Day: 734 I Trust, O Lord, Your Holy Name

About the Hymn of the Day: Today's hymn by Adam Reußner, originally seven stanzas, is a paraphrase of Psalm 31. A psalm paraphrase is a hymn in which, typically, each stanza is based on each successive verse of the psalm. Another famous example is A Mighty Fortress, which is a paraphrase of Psalm 46. As all Psalm are truly prayers to the Father, psalm paraphrases are as well. In today's hymn we start by invoking the holy name of the Lord before praying for steadfast faith in the Word. In stanza 2 we petition the Father to bow down (but not of submission) His gracious ear to hear our cry for protection from earthly affliction. Stanza 3 is simply a confession of God's great <u>active</u> power in our lives, as a mighty rock and battle sword. Stanza 4, perhaps the most

meaningful in this hymn, recalls Christ's words on the cross at His passion. As He prayed the psalms to the Father, so we ask Him to not forsake us (Ps. 22:1) and commend our souls to Him in our earthly life comes to an end. (Ps. 31:5) Finally in stanza 5, we praise the revealed God – the Holy Trinity, through whom we will depart victorious.
