



¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. ²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God’s righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

Hymn of the Day: 555 Salvation unto Us Has Come

We sing stanza 1, 2, 3, 6, 9, and 10

About the Hymn of the Day: There is no doubt that the hymns that came out of the Reformation have spoken to congregations worldwide since they were written. “Salvation Unto Us Has Come” sits among the most well known hymns from that time period, alongside A Mighty Fortress Is Our God, Lord Keep Us Steadfast In Your Word, and others. In Luther’s time, Lutheran (or as they were known at the time, “evangelical catholic”) congregations continued to chant the ordinary (Gloria, Sanctus, etc.) of the Holy Mass in Latin. It was Luther’s desire that one day, every part of the Mass would be sung in the vernacular. These hymns were therefore designed as a type of sung instruction of the catechism, meant to teach the faithful about the core doctrines of our faith. This particular hymn was written by Paul Speratus for a small hymn book known as the

Achtliederbuch, the “eight-hymn book” in 1524. Luther also contributed to this book with Dear Christians One and All Rejoice (LSB 556). This rather long hymn was written to teach about one of the core doctrines of our faith – God’s Grace through faith.

We have an eternal Gospel to proclaim. Christ has freed us from our sins without any works on our part. We are saved by grace alone! And, ironically enough, Luther said this should make him the “apostle of works.” Once we are freed by grace, we are truly free to serve God in works that flow from thankfulness and praise.
