

About the Hymn of the Day: William Walsham How, a 19th century Anglican priest wrote what has become one of the most widely known hymns in Christianity today, "For all the saints who from their labors rest". He was a humble man, rarely mentioning his own poetry, popular as it was. In this hymn, we look onto the saints, like William How, who have shown their faith in Christ through their works on Earth. It is important to remember as we do, that it is Christ who we are praising and addressing, for without Him, even the greatest of saints could not merit the heavenly Paradise. In 8 stanzas, the hymn touches on the three stages of Christian existence. In the first two, we remember the saints who have died in Christ's embrace. In 3 through 6, we pray for those still on Earth, working to expand and defend the kingdom of God. In the final two stanzas, we anticipate the Last Day when, like our Lord on Easter, we will be resurrected into glorified bodies.




